## **COVID-19: CLEANING AND DISINFECTING**

**Intent:** Employers have an obligation to maintain clean workplaces. However, during the Covid-19 pandemic, that obligation is under sharper focus because transmission of the virus may take place when a person touches a contaminated surface and then touches their face.

## **Policies and Procedures:**

- 1. All employees have a role to play cleaning and disinfecting the workplace, equipment and toys.
  - a. Employees shall be trained on cleaning and disinfecting during Covid-19.
  - b. Only equipment and toys which can be readily cleaned and disinfected shall be used. For example, plush toys will be excluded.
- 2. MPCC employees are supported by professional cleaning staff of the City of Ottawa and Ottawa Carleton District School Board (OCDSB).
- 3. Commonly used cleaners and disinfectants are effective against the Covid-19 virus.
  - a. Only disinfectants that have a Health Canada Drug Identification Number (DIN) and approved for use in Canada will be used.
  - b. Prior to use, the expiry date of the product shall be checked.
  - c. The manufacturer's instructions on the proper use of the product, including contact time, shall be followed.
  - d. Where possible, pre-mixed solutions shall be used.
  - e. Gloves shall be worn when handling cleaning products, including wipes.
  - f. Cleaners, disinfectants, gloves, and paper towels shall be provided to employees.
  - g. Cleaners and disinfectants shall be in their original containers or well marked for identification.
- 4. In addition to routine cleaning, surfaces that have frequent contact with hands should be cleaned and disinfected twice per day, and also when visibly dirty.
- 5. A cleaner, which breaks down grease and removes organic material from the surface, should be used separately before using disinfectants.
- 6. Disinfectants, which have chemicals to kill germs, should be applied after surfaces have been cleaned.
- 7. Products, such as disinfectant wipes, have combined cleaners and disinfectants in one solution.
  - a. Not recommended for heavily soiled surfaces.
  - b. May become dry due to fast drying properties at which time they should be discarded.
- 8. Equipment or supplies which are designated to a specific person, not shared, need not be cleaned and disinfected between uses.
- 9. A cleaning and disinfecting log shall be maintained.
- 10. Only one cohort should access the washroom at a time, and facilities should be cleaned between each use, particularly if different cohorts are using the same washroom.
